



Accommodations

At the rustic AMC huts we sleep in coed bunkrooms, though bathrooms are separate. They supply three wool blankets and a pillow. Breakfast is served at 7 am and dinner at 6 pm. Meals are hot and hearty - a wonderful way to end and begin our active days. Each hut also has a small store where you can purchase high-energy snacks for your lunches each day. This would be in addition to my special GORP that I will provide for you. If we are lucky, they may even have leftovers from last night's dinner to take with us for lunch. It is important to bring your own sleep sack or sheet and a flashlight. It is dark at night and you'll need a light to find your way around the hut and to the restrooms.

We will be staying in two AMC lodges, the Highland Center (in Crawford Notch) and Joe Dodge Lodge (in Pinkham Notch). At the Highland Center Lodge (the newest AMC lodge) we will be in rooms with 4 bunks each and will share a bathroom. At Joe Dodge Lodge we will be in 2-bunk rooms with a shared bathroom. Both lodges serve a breakfast buffet from 6:30 – 8:30 am and a 4-course family-style dinner, served promptly at 6:00 pm. Beer and wine are available with dinner. Linens and towels are provided and we'll have hot showers too.

Lakes of the Clouds Hut (elevation 5050')

The highest and most popular hut in the chain, Lakes of the Clouds Hut is located on the southern shoulder of Mount Washington. This hut offers sweeping views, gorgeous sunrises and sunsets, and proximity to rare alpine flowers.

Mizpah Spring Hut (elevation 3800')

Mizpah means "pillar in the wilderness," an apt name for this hut nestled on the southern flank of Mount Clinton. The hut overlooks Montalban Range, the Dry River Wilderness, and Crawford Notch, and features large, south-facing windows, varied-size bunkrooms, and a separate library and game room.

Zealand Falls Hut (elevation 2700')

Located in Zealand Notch, this hut occupies a choice four-season spot near waterfalls and outstanding views at the eastern edge of the Pemigewasset Wilderness. This is the perfect place to spot a moose and other abundant wildlife.
